REACH is developing key performance indicators for each focus area throughout 2024, to ensure the data we provide is both measurable and meaningful.

AREA OF FOCUS	IMPACT STATEMENT
Combatting Human Trafficking and Exploitation	Heightened awareness and increased alignment for combatting human trafficking in Alberta occurs.
Diverting Crisis	High-needs populations have pathways to safer circumstances.
Prioritizing Anti-Racism, Indigenization and Lived Experience	Equitable approaches enhance community capacity and feelings of safety across Edmonton.
Supporting Immigration and Refugees	A system and navigation to support successful community integration and economic and social outcomes for newcomers is in place.
Mitigating Addiction and Mental Health Problems	Stigma associated with addiction and mental health is reduced, and there is better awareness, education and person-centred approaches.
Building Safe and Inclusive Neighbourhoods	Community leaders are supported and developed to advance safety for their communities.
Preventing Violence	Enhanced comprehension, better recognition and implementation of effective interventions targeting risk factors to reduce violence is achieved.
Promoting Family, Child and Youth Success	Families, children and youth have successful, healthy and safer futures.
